

# What You Should Know About HBCUs & PBIs

## What are HBCUs and PBIs?

HBCUs (Historically Black Colleges and Universities) are institutions founded before 1964, and were designed to extend higher education opportunities to Black Americans at a time when this privilege was limited. There are approximately 100 HBCUs around the country, with one even being housed in the state of Delaware!

PBIs (Predominantly Black Institutions) also aim to educate Black American students and were founded after 1964. They play a significant role in serving historically underrepresented groups in higher education and giving them access to supportive learning environments.

HBCU's must serve a minimum of 70% black students and 50% students from low income households?

Both provide culturally affirming spaces that help students thrive socially and academically.

### Why are these institutions important?

HBCUs and PBIs not only give students the tools to succeed in the real world like other colleges and universities, but are spaces for underrepresented students to find community and be celebrated in higher education.

- The Universities Mission is "to leverage a proud HBCU legacy and commitment to excellence in every field of human endeavor to enhance the recruitment and preparation of talented professionals to contribute to a sustainable, global community."
- Over 70% of all students at DSU identify as Black or African American.
- DSU has over <u>60 programs</u>, including associate, bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees—from agriculture and business to health sciences and education.
